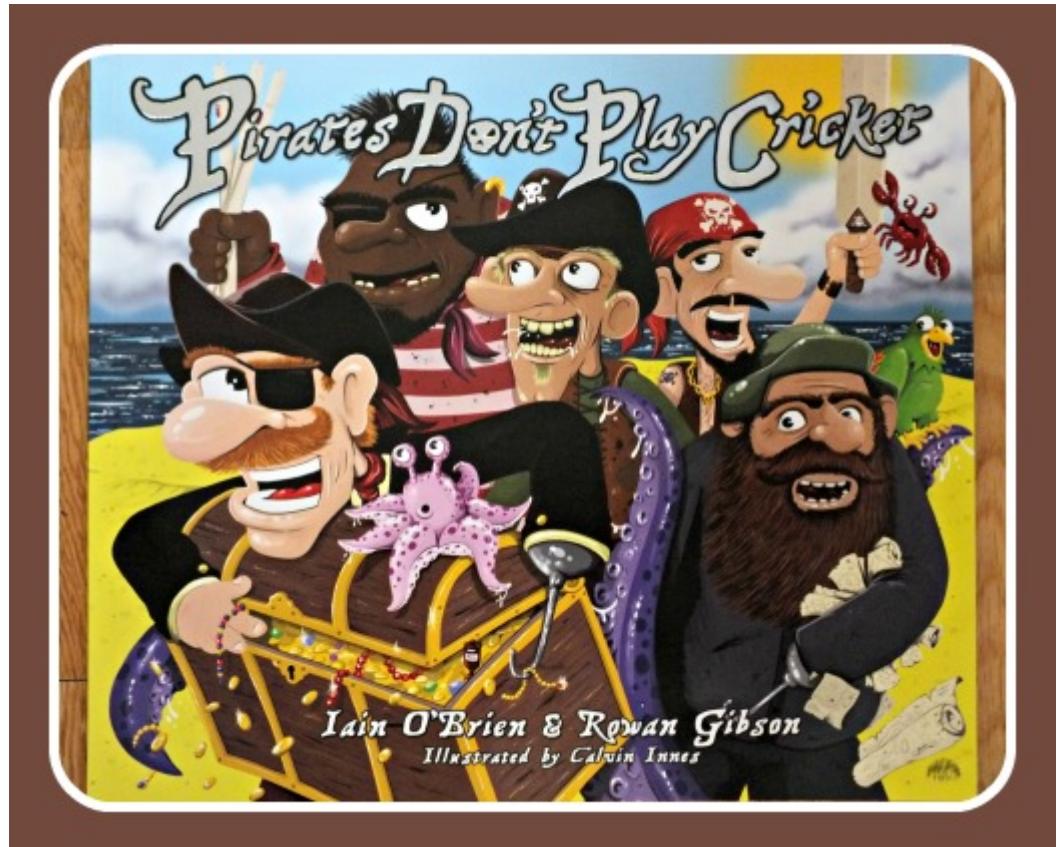


Two book reviews

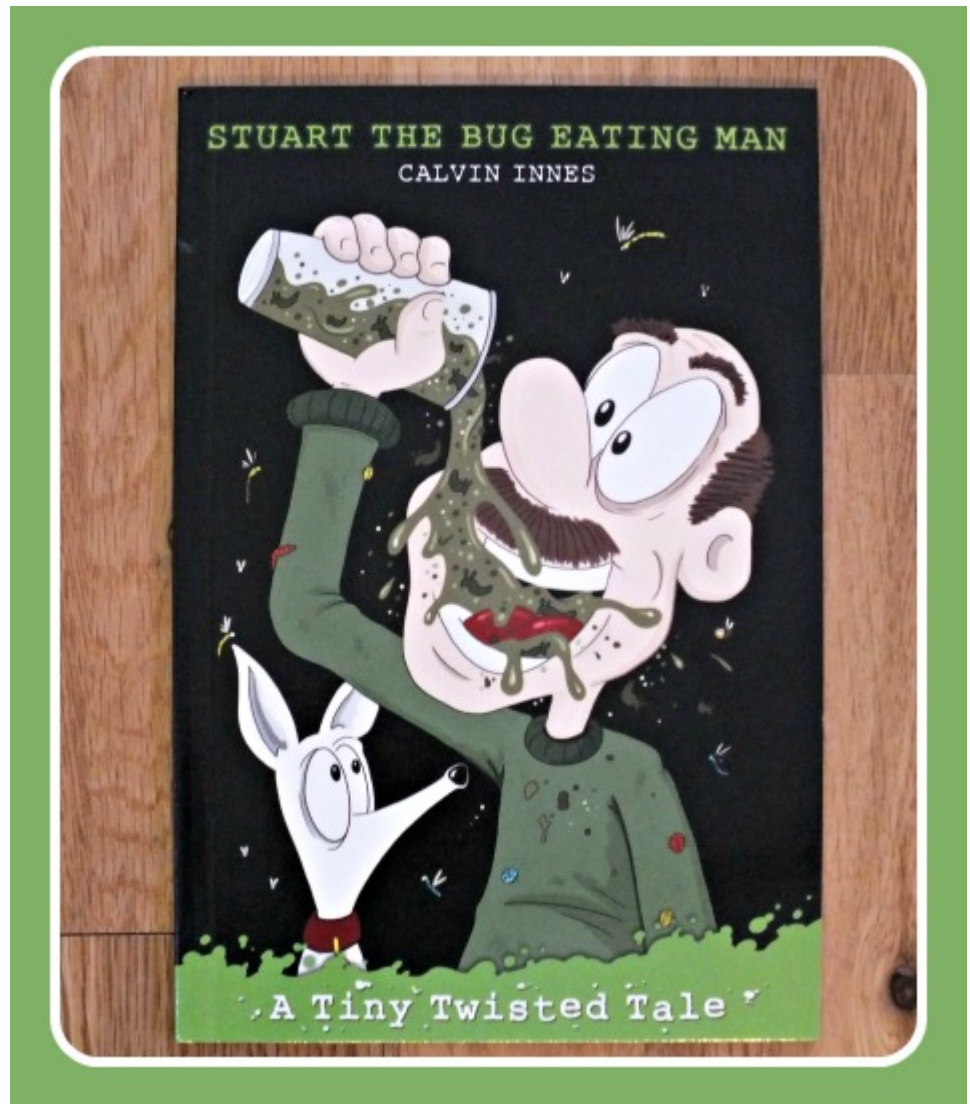


Pirates don't play cricket
