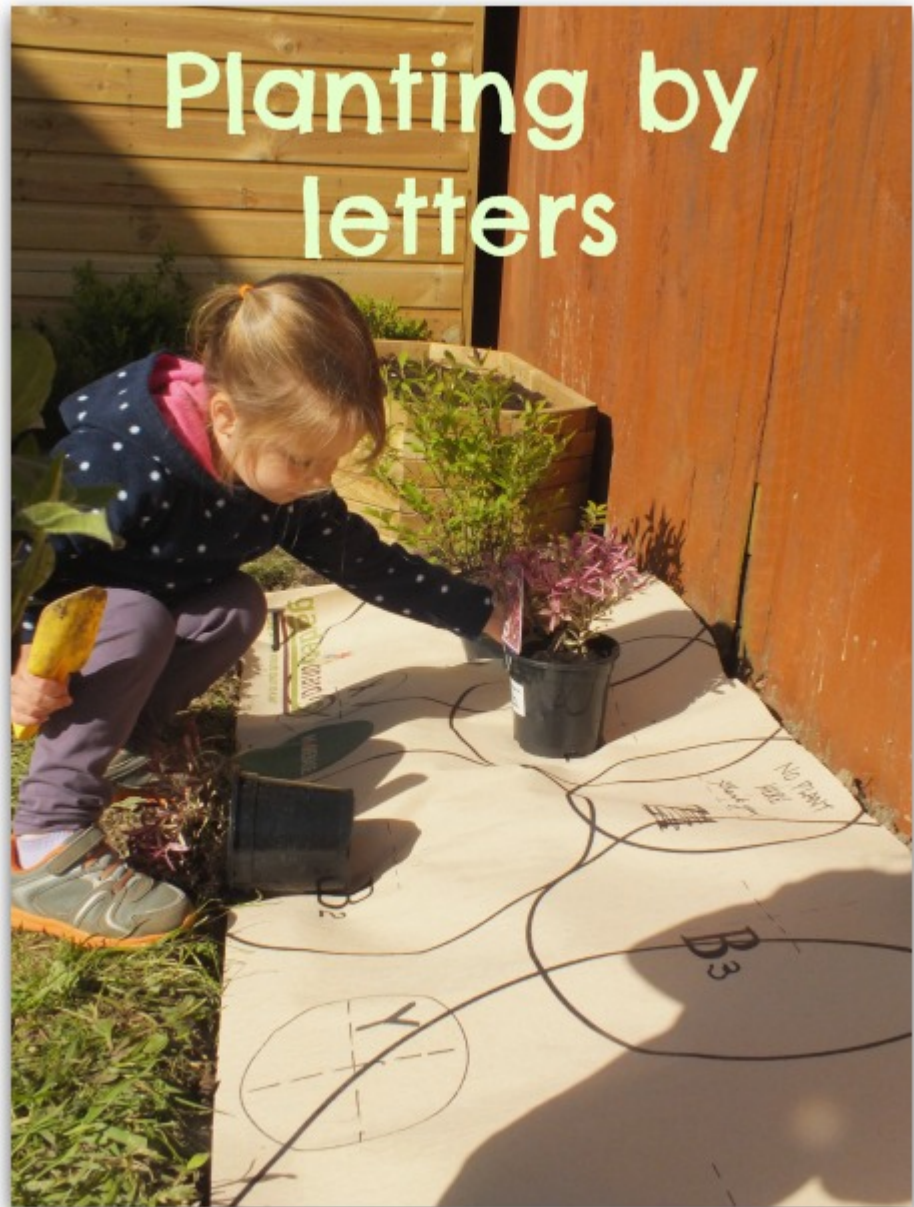


Planting by letters

This year we have continued our garden project, by sorting out the grass and adding a new border, in order to soften the look of the fence and bring some nice plants into the garden. You choose your style depending on the type of garden you have i.e. sunny or shady and what type of plants, e.g. ever green, mixed border, low maintenance etc. You measure the area, then order your plants.

The plants arrive in a box, with them all in alphabetically labelled pots. Also, you get a plan which you lay out on your prepared border and plant the corresponding plant into the letter on the plan. This ensures the plants are correctly spaced for their growth, height and design. For us clueless gardeners, this was a fantastic idea!
